Guest Lecture on Sustainability in Business

On May 4, 2025, the School hosted a lecture on "Sustainability in Business" delivered by Dr. Lina Khattab, worked as a Lecturer in the Business Administration Department at Cairo University and University of York in England. The session introduced students to key concepts of sustainability, including the United Nations' definition, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and case studies such as the University of York.

The discussion also explored key issues such as the fast fashion crisis and the role of universities in promoting sustainability. Seminar on Accounting in the Digital Age

On May 7, 2025, the school held a seminar titled "Accounting in the Digital Age: Challenges and Solutions," delivered by Dr. Ibrahim Fekry, Accounting Lead at Siemens Company. The session explored how emerging technologies such as automation, artificial intelligence, and cloud computing are transforming the accounting profession, along with the challenges and ethical considerations these changes bring. The seminar provided valuable insights into current digital trends and highlighted the importance of continuous learning and technological literacy for future accounting professionals.

Guest Lecture on Financing Entrepreneurial Projects

On May 13, 2025, the school hosted a lecture titled "Entrepreneurial Journey & Financing Entrepreneurial Projects." The session featured Mr. Ahmed Tayea, Vice President of the Small and Medium Enterprises Development Unit, and Mrs. Aya Ashraf, Non-Financial Services Officer at the SME Development Agency in 6th of October City. The lecture introduced students and faculty to the financial stages of entrepreneurship and highlighted the importance of selecting the right funding sources to support business growth.



Participants gained valuable insights into various financing methods such as personal savings, bank loans, angel investors, venture capital, and crowdfunding. The session also covered key topics like investor pitching, financial planning, and current trends in entrepreneurial finance, supported by practical case studies. Lecture on Economic and Political Challenges Facing the Egyptian Economy



On May 18, 2025, the school hosted a distinguished lecture titled "The Economic and Political Challenges Facing the Egyptian Economy and Their Impact on Economic Growth." The session was delivered by Staff Major General Dr. Bahgat Mohamed Farid, a strategic and military expert, former Director of the National Defense College, and holder of a PhD in State Defense Preparation Strategy.

The lecture addressed key issues including inflation, currency depreciation, foreign debt, and the intersection between political decisions and economic development.

Accounting Case Competition Empowers Students with Real-World Experience

On May 21st, 2025, the school hosted an engaging Accounting Case Competition at the Main Auditorium. This event brought together 12 undergraduate accounting students, 12 academic staff, and 5 industry professionals, aiming to enhance analytical thinking, teamwork, and presentation skills through real-life accounting challenges.



Led by esteemed experts including Ms. Nurihan Abdelbary (ACCA Market Development Manager – Egypt), Mr. Osama Samy (CFA, CPA, CMA, and more), and Mr. Mohamed Abdelgawad (Accounting Manager at Schneider Electric), the competition covered vital topics such as international accounting standards, financial modeling, valuation techniques, and career pathways including key certifications like ACCA, CMA, and FMVA.

Students gained valuable insights into approaching complex accounting problems systematically and communicating their solutions confidently. The event also provided professional guidance on career development beyond textbooks, fostering a practical understanding of the industry.











Major Selection Orientation Day for First-Year Students

On May 25, 2025, the school held a Major Selection Orientation Day to support first-year students in choosing their academic specializations. The event featured presentations by faculty members and industry professionals, including experts in economics, finance, human resources, marketing, and business technology. Speakers provided valuable insights into each major's academic content, career paths, and real-world applications.

As part of the orientation, students completed an online assessment developed by the school to help them explore their abilities and interests. This customized tool was designed to guide students toward the major that best aligns with their strengths and career aspirations.

Students had the opportunity to engage with professionals such as Dr. Karim Mohamed (Arab African International Bank), Dr. Dina Abdelazeem (Economist), Mr. Ahmed Tawfik (Methode Electronics), and Mr. Hany Galal (Emirates Auction), among others. The session was well-received, with students gaining a clearer understanding of each major and how it aligns with their interests and future goals. Students Tour at Juhayna Factory

On Tuesday, April 29th, 2025, our students visited Juhayna's factories located in the industrial area of 6th of October. This factory tour was designed to enrich students' applied knowledge by providing direct exposure to Juhayna's production processes.

During the visit, students observed the manufacturing of key products such as milk and juices and explored the concept of the production line. They also appreciated the advanced technology utilized to optimize efficiency throughout the operations.

Students Visit National Anti-Corruption Academy

On Tuesday, May 6th, 2025, 14 participants, including 11 students and 3 staff members from the school, attended a seminar at the National Anti-Corruption Academy. The visit aimed to introduce students to the complexities of corruption, its risks, and the national strategies deployed to combat it, while emphasizing ethical conduct and accountability.

General Ahmed Mansour delivered a powerful lecture covering various forms of corruption such as bribery, embezzlement, nepotism, and fraud. He detailed their social, economic, and political impacts, and explained the institutional mechanisms in place to prevent and fight corruption. A compelling real-life case study video of a government employee's arrest underscored the Academy's rigorous investigative and legal efforts, deeply resonating with the students.

Participants found the experience highly educational, gaining a richer understanding of the importance of transparency and good governance. Moving forward, the school plans include ongoing collaboration with the Academy and organizing similar sessions for students at the October branch.

Students Visit to Edita Factory

They observed firsthand the manufacturing of popular products such as Molto and Brownies, and learned about the efficiency achieved through state-of-the-art production lines.

Feedback from the students was overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing a desire for more field visits to deepen their understanding of real-world business cycles, particularly in diverse sectors like cosmetics. Following this successful visit, the school plans to organize additional tours to enhance experiential learning and strengthen the connection between classroom theories and market realities.

Mohamed was honored as one of the winners of the IMF's Youth Research Competition. During the conference, which brought together leading economists and policymakers from institutions such as UC Berkeley, MIT, University of Chicago, Oxford, and Peking University, Mohamed was publicly recognized for his outstanding research potential and received a certificate of appreciation from the IMF. His participation in this high-level global event highlights both his individual excellence and the Schools' ongoing commitment to supporting impactful research and international engagement.



Research Publications

Mohamed Badawy, Assistant Lecturer in Applied Economics, published a paper titled "Measuring Fiscal Policy Uncertainty: The Case of Egypt" published in the journal Public Budgeting and Finance. The study introduces a novel composite index of fiscal policy uncertainty (FPU) for Egypt, covering the period from 1982 to 2023.
